2ND SUNDAY OF LENT - YEAR C

17 MARCH 2019

First Reading

Gen 15:5-12, 17-18

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified. 'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied, 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off. Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms: 'To your descendants I give this land, from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'

Second Reading

Phil 3:17 - 4:1

My brothers, be united in following my rule of life. Take as your models everybody who is already doing this and study them as you used to study us. I have told you often, and I repeat it today with tears, there are many who are behaving as the enemies of the cross of Christ. They are destined to be lost. They make foods into their god and they are proudest of something they

ought to think shameful; the things they think important are earthly things. For us, our homeland is in heaven, and from heaven comes the saviour we are waiting for, the Lord Jesus Christ, and he will transfigure these wretched bodies of ours into copies of his glorious body. He will do that by the same power with which he can subdue the whole universe. So then, my brothers and dear friends, do not give way but remain faithful in the Lord. I miss you very much, dear friends; you are my joy and my crown.

Gospel

Lk 9:28-36

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' - He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow; and when they went into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him.' And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.

I Was On Mount Tabor



Some of the happenings in life might be more of an uphill experience harder than trekking huge mountains. When I was appointed to Palar in Kerala to start up a parish there, it was strenuous. It was a place with no power supply, telephone or a road to reach there. The only asset was a group baptised people who were like the disciple James, John and Peter on the top of Mount Tabor with Jesus. These disciples “Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep” (Luke 9:32) and barely awake to see the glory of Christ. There was a shed for me to use as church and residence. I was spending from my own pocket for my upkeep. Though there was no tabernacle for preservation of Blessed Sacrament, I decided to start a First Friday devotion with prayer service imitating the Holy Hour. Even after much publicity the response to this call was zero. I started to realise that my mission in Palar is a more strenuous uphill trek than climbing Mount Tabor, the mighty mountain in Galilee. According to the Gospel the disciples on the Mountain Top had a vision of Jesus talking about his departure from Jerusalem. He was talking with Moses representing the Law and Elijah, the first of prophets. Like the Hebrew people departing from the slavery of Egypt through the desert and red sea to the Promised Land, Jesus was to depart at last from Jerusalem through Calvary to the glory of Resurrection and New Life. I, as a disciple of Christ, was telling the people of Palar that we are to depart from the hopeless and selfish individuals to a people of God and celebrate the glory of God given dignity in our life. But with my failure in attracting anyone to the First Friday devotion, my vision was clouded and I did not know what to do. Now looking back, I can say it was like the cloud that covered Jesus and his companions on Mount Tabor. While I was still struggling to discern an effective mission, like having lost the vision in mist, one of my parishioners came inviting me to her house to read, preach, pray with Bible, the Word of God. It was like what James, John and Peter heard from the cloud on Mt Tabor. “This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!” (Luke 9:35). The disciples quietly reflected on their experience of Jesus as the beloved Son of God. I quietly went about conducting prayers services in homes, meditating with my parishioners on the Word of God. The promises of Christ came true before my eyes. Within a couple of years, the people of Palar gave up ungodly things like cultivating marijuana, drunkenness, and a self-centred life. They became a new people, with hope, joy, and fellowship. Now Palar is a thriving parish, celebrating Christian fellowship.

Now look back into your own life. You too may find times you felt like climbing a difficult mountain to praying God. In spite of your prayers and discernment, you may have felt like your vision forward is masked as if in a cloud or mist. But God did not leave you confused for long. You heard the Word of God. You continued meditation on what Jesus Christ is teaching. Since you stayed awake like the disciples on Mount tabor, you see the glory of Christ. Now you are empowered to celebrate the joy, peace, and fellowship of the disciple of Christ. Anyone who walks with Christ will have this experience.

REFLECTIONS ON LUKE 9:28-36

Scriptural Context. The Gospel Parallels.

The account of the Transfiguration appears in all three synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke). The word, synoptic, means ‘seen together’ and these three gospels can be seen together because they have so much material in common. It is now accepted that the gospel of Mark was the first written as so much of it appears in the other two, while the gospels of Matthew and Luke both seem to have drawn on another source of Jesus material (known as the ‘Q’ source). Despite the parallels, each writer uses the same story to convey the particular message of that gospel.

Gospel Focus. Asleep again?

It seems that at crucial points in the gospel where Jesus’ true identity and mission are revealed, the disciples are falling asleep! The gospel of Luke is unique in suggesting that the disciples were sleepy at the Transfiguration. They managed to fight off sleep in this instance, but were fast asleep at the Mount of Olives, as Jesus prayed in agony. The sleepiness of the disciples at these crucial times is indicative of limited grasps of what Jesus is on about. They are wearied by all that he asks of them, rather than energised by it, and consequently they’re not ready to witness great events when they come along.

Living the Gospel. ‘Listen to him!’

God’s voice from the cloud claims Jesus as his Son, the Chosen One and then goes on to instruct those present - and we, the readers - to ‘Listen to him!’ For the disciples, this was a message not to get carried away with their own ideas about the Messiah but to listen to what Jesus was saying about the suffering he must endure and to what he was saying about true discipleship. Jesus tells us that to be a follower of his involves sacrifice, hardship and often unpopularity. It is this message we must listen to as much as the promise of salvation.

From the Confession of Saint Patrick

I give unceasing thanks to my God, who kept me faithful in the day of my testing. Today I can offer him sacrifice with confidence, giving myself as a living victim to Christ, my Lord, who kept me safe through all my trials. I can say now: Who am I, Lord, and what is my calling, that you worked through me with such divine power? You did all this so that today among the Gentiles I might constantly rejoice and glorify your name wherever I may be, both in prosperity and in adversity. You did it so that, whatever happened to me, I might accept good and evil equally, always giving thanks to God. God showed me how to have faith in him for ever, as one who is never to be doubted. He answered my prayer in such a way that in the last days, ignorant though I am, I might be bold enough to take up so holy and so wonderful a task, and imitate in some degree those whom the Lord had so long ago foretold as heralds of his Gospel, bearing witness to all nations.

How did I get this wisdom, that was not mine before? I did not know the number of my days, or have knowledge of God. How did so great and salutary a gift come to me, the gift of knowing and loving God, though at the cost of homeland and family? I came to the Irish peoples to preach the Gospel and endure the taunts of unbelievers, putting up with reproaches about my earthly pilgrimage, suffering many persecutions, even bondage, and losing my birthright of freedom for the benefit of others.

If I am worthy, I am ready also to give up my life, without hesitation and most willingly, for his name. I want to spend myself in that country, even in death, if the Lord should grant me this favour. I am deeply in his debt, for he gave me the great grace that through me many peoples should be reborn in God, and then made perfect by confirmation and everywhere among them clergy ordained for a people so recently coming to believe, one people gathered by the Lord from the ends of the earth. As God had prophesied of old through the prophets: The nations shall come to you from the ends of the earth, and say: "How false are the idols made by our fathers: they are useless." In another prophecy he said: I have set you as a light among the nations, to bring salvation to the ends of the earth.

It is among that people that I want to wait for the promise made by him, who assuredly never tells a lie. He makes this promise in the Gospel: They shall come from the east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. This is our faith: believers are to come from the whole world.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Monday, 18 March - St Patrick, bishop (Solemnity)



St. Patrick was born in Britain c.385 and as a young man was captured by Irish pirates and sold into slavery. After six years in Ireland he escaped, returned to his family and trained for the priesthood in Gaul. In c.435 he returned to

Ireland as a missionary bishop. Through his work, Christianity flourished and the church became organised. Although not extensively learned, St Patrick was known for his sincerity and pastoral care, and was largely concerned with abolishing paganism and idolatry and encouraged monasticism. There are many legends about Ireland's most beloved saint, including his use of the shamrock for explaining the trinity, and his banishing of all snakes from Ireland.

Tuesday, 19 March - St Joseph, husband of Mary (Solemnity)



St Joseph, the husband of the Virgin Mary and adoptive father of Jesus, was a descendant of King David and a carpenter by trade. During his betrothal to Mary he became distressed when he heard that she was with child, but an angelic vision reassured him that this was all part of God's plan.

After Jesus' birth he was warned in a dream to flee with his family to Egypt, in order to escape from King Herod. Joseph showed great faith in his willingness to do whatever God asked of him. St Joseph is the patron saint of many causes including families, expectant mothers, workers and people in doubt.
